Location

Adliswil is located in the Sihl Valley within the district of Horgen, nestled between the Zimmerberg and the Albis mountain range. Bordering Zurich to the north, Adliswil is surrounded by natural landscapes to the west and south. The Sihl flows through Adliswil in a south to north direction, offering many beautiful areas for walks, outdoor sports activities and picnics. Thanks to the suburban railway (S-Bahn) and the nearby access to the motorway, Adliswil is ideally placed in terms of transport links.

Transportation

Pedestrians and cyclists

The town's attractive public spaces are popular for walking. Cycling is also a part of everyday life in Adliswil. The carefully designed public spaces make cycling an attractive option in many neighbourhoods. With the implementation of the pedestrian and cycling concept, Adliswil aims to promote walking and cycling throughout the town.

Private transport

Adliswil is connected to the neighbouring municipalities via the main roads Sihltalstrasse, Zürichstrasse, Albistrasse and Kilchbergstrasse. The nearby motorway junction "Wollishofen" (A3) is located in Zurich-Wollishofen and leads to Zurich Airport, Bern, Basel and Chur. In addition to the busy main roads, various 30 km/h zones form an attractive traffic concept for all road users, thus increasing road safety and reducing noise pollution as well as transit-traffic and slow-moving traffic.

Parking

Parking in public car parks in Adliswil may be subject to charges and time restrictions. Long-term parking permits (daily, weekly or annual parking permits) can be purchased for the designated parking zones. S-Bahn (suburban rail)

Adliswil railway station is the town's main public transport hub. The S4 will take you to Zurich main train station in 16 minutes or to Langnau a.A and Sihlwald. The SZU (Sihltal-Zurich-Uetliberg railway) runs at 10-minute intervals during peak hours. Additional S-Bahn stations are located in Sood-Oberleimbach and Sihlau. Police

The Adliswil-Langnau a.A. police force is responsible for maintaining public safety and order. It is on hand to deal with all matter relating to traffic, parking, administrative policing and crime prevention. Contact: adliswil.ch/polizei. The cantonal police department is responsible for criminal matters. The combined police station at Zürichstrasse 8 is shared by the Adliswil-Langnau a.A. police and the cantonal police and is the place to turn to for all your concerns regarding safety and security.

Fire brigade

Adliswil has an active and well-trained volunteer fire brigade. Around 60 men and women volunteers are on call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to provide assistance in emergencies. Contact: adliswil.ch/feuerwehr

Civil defence

The Zimmerberg Civil Defence Association (Zivilschutz Zimmerberg) unites the civil defence organisations in the district of Horgen and provides competent and uncomplicated support to the emergency services in the event of disasters and emergencies. For more information: zvzz.ch

Permits

Dogs

All dogs must be micro-chipped and registered within three months of birth. The micro-chip is inserted by a vet. Register your dog on our website: adliswil.ch/hunde. You will then be sent your user data and password by post, and you can register your dog in amicus.ch, the Swiss nationwide dog database.



Healthcare

Doctors

Hospitals

The See-Spital hospital is located in Horgen. Hospitals in Zurich can also be reached easily, with the nearest accident and emergency unit located at Triemli Municipal Hospital.

Spitex

Spitex (home care) provides a wide range of services that go far beyond medical care. Spitex supports and enables people of all ages to continue living in their home environment for longer; to leave hospital earlier and to manage difficult situations more easily. Infrastructure

Electricity (EKZ)

In Adliswil, electricity and public lighting are supplied by Elektrizitätswerke des Kantons Zürich (EKZ). Customers can have a say in the energy sources that make up their own individual electricity mix. The emergency number in the event of a disruption is 0800 359 359. Defective streetlights can be registered at melder.ekz.ch. For further information: ekz.ch.

Water (Energie 360°)

The annual drinking water consumption in Adliswil is 1.6 million cubic metres per year. The majority of the water, around 70%, is drawn from the two groundwater pumping stations at Soodmatten and Sihlweid. A further 27% stems from various proprietary sources, with the remainder being purchased as required. Energie 360° is in charge of operations. 24-hour emergency number for defective water pipes or contaminated drinking water: 0800 024 024. For further information: energie360.ch

Waste water (ARA Sihltal)

The Sihltal water treatment plant is responsible for purifying wastewater from Adliswil, Langnau a.A. and Gattikon. The wastewater is collected in a wide-reaching sewer network and channelled to the wastewater treatment plant. For further information: arasihltal.ch

Waste collection

Household waste and small bulky items

Refuse can be deposited in the designated areas using the special waste disposal bags issued by Zweckverband Entsorgung Zimmerberg (EZI). Labels can be purchased for small bulky items. The waste disposal bags can be purchased from retailers in Adliswil, and you can order bulky goods labels at adliswil.ch/sperrgutmarken. Refuse is collected from all districts of Adliswil on Mondays and Thursdays. Refuse may only be put out for collection by 7 am on the day of collection. Leaving refuse out overnight is not permitted.

Waste paper collection

Newspapers and paper (excluding cardboard and paper carrier bags) can be bundled and tied together and put out at the designated collection points before 7 am on the day of collection. Collections are made every month, irrespective of the weather. For dates and reminders, go to adliswil.ch/entsorgung

Cardboard collection

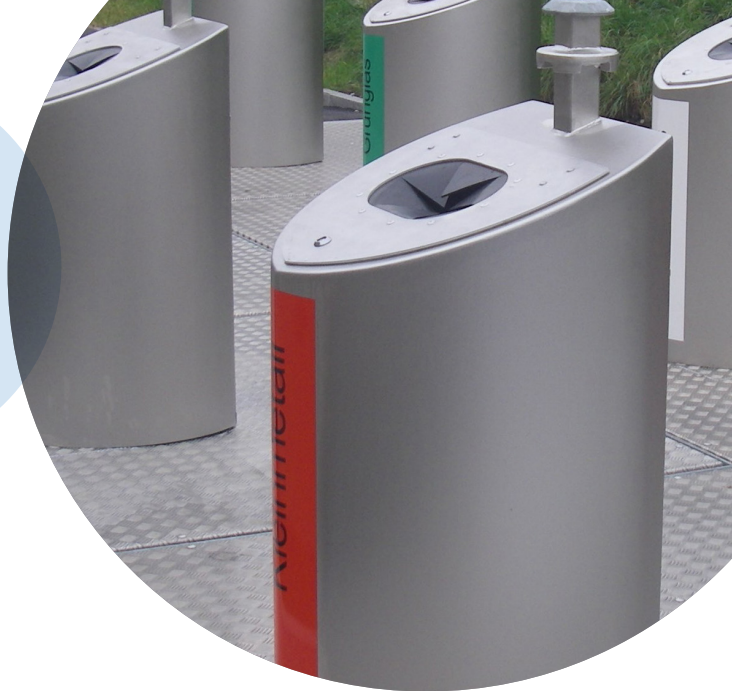
Cardboard boxes can be bundled and tied together and deposited at the designated collection points before 7 a.m. on the day of collection. Collections are made twice a month, irrespective of the weather. For dates and reminders, go to adliswil.ch/entsorgung

Green waste collection

Garden and kitchen waste is collected every Wednesday. The green waste containers must be placed at the designated refuse collection points before 7 am.

Separate collection dates are arranged for hazardous waste and old clothes.

Waste disposal centres

Glass, small metal items, clothing

There are seven secondary collection points (Nebensammelstellen, NS) in the town of Adliswil where you can dispose of waste glass, small metal items and used clothing. The collection points are open from Monday to Saturday between 7 am and 12 pm and 1 pm and 7 pm.

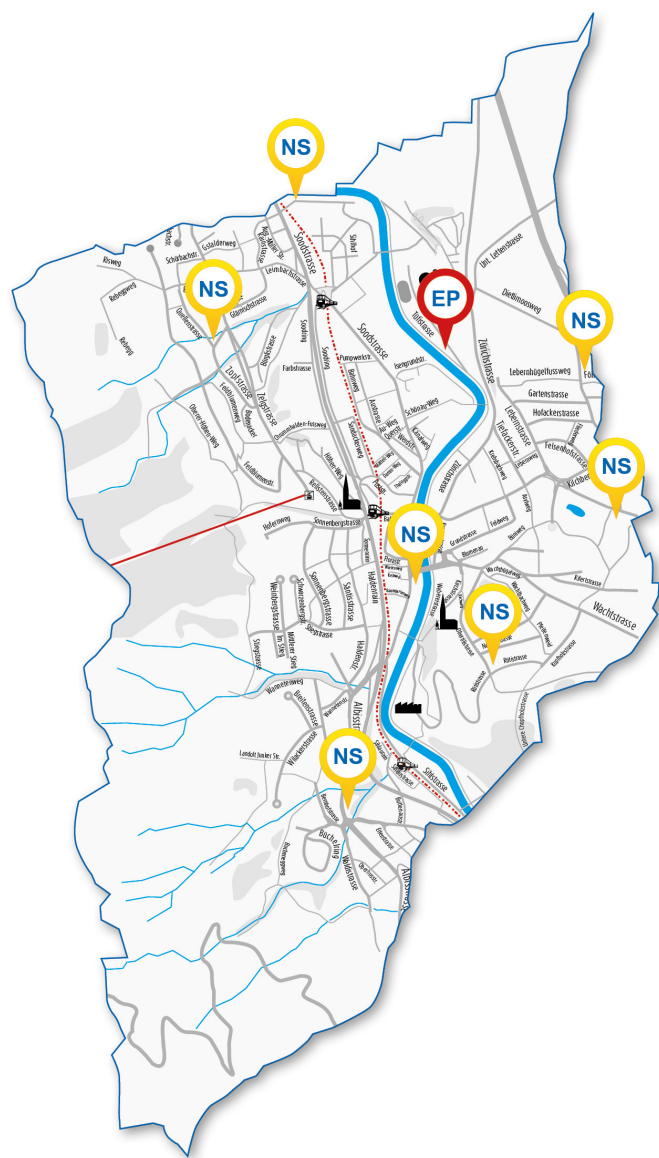
Adliswil waste disposal centre (Entsorgungspark Adliswil, EP)

Culture and leisure

Culture in Adliswil

Adliswil has a wide range of cultural events to offer. You will find the calendar of events at adliswil.ch/agenda. The Kulturschachtle association is responsible for coordinating Adliswil's cultural events programme, which includes theatre, concerts, exhibitions, readings and more. The Kulturschachtle building on the grounds of the Kronenwiese can also be booked for events. For further information: kulturschachtle.ch

Library (Regionalbibliothek)

Residents of all ages can avail themselves of the following services provided by the municipal library on Bahnhofplatz: Books, audio books, e-media via Onleihe, magazines, DVDs, online film streaming, games, board games, a coffee corner with daily newspapers, free events, a range of workstations and free internet access. Haus Brugg

Haus Brugg on Bahnhofplatz has been conceived as a place where people can meet. The building's different function rooms and facilities (including a kitchen) can be booked individually for training courses, meetings or cultural events. Neighbourhood and community networks

Neighbourhood associations in Adliswil provide the opportunity to get involved, take an active role and quickly get to know other people who live in the same neighbourhood. The municipal community work centre (Fachstelle Gemeinwesenarbeit) works with local residents, other administrative departments and partners to foster a vibrant and diverse life in the town. It brings together stakehol-

Freizeitanlage Werd (leisure facility)

With its large playground next to the Sihl, Freizeitanlage Werd organises a wide range of courses for children, young people, senior citizens and families. The wood and ceramics workshops ("offene Werkstätten" are open to anyone who would like to try their hand at creative and technical crafts under expert guidance. Outdoor barbecue areas

Public barbecue areas can be found at the Kopfholz reservoir, on the Sihl at Tüfi and at the Feldblume playground. A number of well-equipped playgrounds give children plenty of space to play and let off steam. For further information: adliswil.ch/grillspielplatz

Felsenegg cable car

Adliswil is home to the canton of Zurich's sole cable car. From Adliswil railway station, follow the well-signposted route to the bottom station (Talstation) for the cable car. Wilderness park in the Sihlwald forest

The Sihlwald forest is the largest mixed deciduous forest in the Swiss Mittelland region. Some 17 species of wild animals can be observed here as if they were roaming freely in the wild. The wildlife park is home to brown bears, wolves, elk and marmots. For further information: wildnispark.ch



Sports

Nature

Being so close to nature and blessed with a range of different natural environments, Adliswil is the perfect location to participate in a wide range of activities. These include walking, jogging, cycling and hiking along the Sihl or uphill through the extensive forests on the Albis and Zimmerberg hills. There is a bike course for children and beginners at Kopfholzwald forest.

Clubs and associations

Adliswil boasts a comprehensive network of sports clubs. More than 1,000 sports enthusiasts participate in local clubs every day. As well as gyms, private operators also run a range of martial arts classes, a bouldering hall, dancing and theatre lessons, and a host of classes to promote physical health and wellbeing. Tüfi sports centre and fun park

Adliswil's largest sports centre features a three-court gymnasium with a spectator stand, a parquet hall equipped with a climbing wall, a six-lane athletics track, a multifunctional area for roller sports, a grass pitch and an artificial turf pitch. A canteen catering for up to 65 people and a meeting room for around 30 people round off the facilities. The changing rooms can be used between 12:00 and 1:15 p.m. Monday to Friday for individual training. All sports halls can be booked on adliswil.ch/mieten. Adjacent to the sports centre is a fun park featuring a pump track and skate park elements for children and teenagers. For further information: adliswil.ch/sportanlage

Outdoor fitness

Outdoor fitness equipment is available at several locations in the municipal area, where residents can exercise free of charge. The facilities by the retirement home and the sports field in the valley are aimed at older residents and

people who do not engage in much physical activity. The main site at the Tüfi sports centre also offers challenging training opportunities for those who are more used to exercising. There is another site in Soodmatte. Both locations are equipped with a sports box where sports equipment is provided free of charge. For more information, go to: adliswil.ch/sport

Indoor pool

The indoor facility includes a 25-metre swimming pool, a 1- and 3-metre diving platform, a learn-to-swim pool with a retractable floor, a children's pool complete with slide and water features, and a paddling pool for toddlers, also with water features. The indoor pools are heated to a temperature of 28 degrees, the learn-to-swim pool at 30 degrees and the children's pool at 32 degrees. A number of private partner companies provide additional services at the indoor pool. In addition, a partner company operates a gym and spa centre in the same building. The reception area features a small snack bar and shop.

Outdoor pool

The popular outdoor pool complex comprises a 25-metre pool, a lazy river, a wide slide and a fun pool. The large sunbathing area is shaded by trees and also features a children's paddling pool, a grass play area including an adventure playground and a beach volleyball court. The restaurant at the open-air pool serves refreshments, food and beverages in the heart of the attractive open-air pool complex.

Childcare and education

Childcare and early education

Adliswil has a wide range of options available for children from three months to pre-school age. The municipal children's day nursery (Kinderhaus Werd), private day nurseries, childminders (arranged by the GFZ foundation), playgroups (some with language support) and other services make it possible to provide care that is tailored to each individual situation. Childcare vouchers (Betreuungsgutscheine) can be applied for to cover the cost of attending day nurseries or childminders in Adliswil. Kindergarten (pre-school)

The two-year kindergarten programme constitutes the entry level of the Zurich public school system. In the second year, children are prepared for their transition to primary school. Parents will automatically receive enrolment forms for kindergarten.

Primary and secondary school

Primary school follows on from kindergarten and runs for six years. There are six primary schools in Adliswil: Kopfholz, Sonnenberg, Wilacker, Zopf, Werd and Dietlimoos. After primary school, pupils move on to secondary school, which they attend for three years. Secondary schools are located at Hofern and Zentrum Kronenwiese. After-school care programme

From kindergarten onwards, schools provide a professional range of after-school care. Each of the six primary schools offers a programme.

School administration

The school administration office is the first point of contact for all matters relating to schools in Adliswil and how they are run. For further information: adliswil.ch/bildung

Counselling services

The Department of Education provides advice on a range of topics. Consultorio is a support centre for non-German-speaking students and their parents. A team of social workers supports children and young people who are experiencing difficulties of a personal or social nature. School psychologists provide support in the event of any problems that arise in connection with school.

Promotion and therapy

Schools provide integrated support for children and young people with special educational needs. The following services provide support: The "Pfiffika" programme provides children with exceptional abilities with additional educational opportunities within small groups. Speech therapy provides support for those experiencing difficulties with language or in expressing themselves verbally or in writing. Psychomotor therapy is aimed at children and young people experiencing behavioural issues or difficulties with their physical mobility.

Music lessons

Around 45 highly trained, dedicated music teachers provide professional music lessons and most of them are also active concert performers. Continuous professional development ensures that teaching is based on the latest research. Lessons are held in the attractive new music centre. For further information: adliswil.ch/musikschule

Adolescents

Youth work centre

The Youth Work Unit is committed to making the town a child- and youth-friendly environment. The centre is responsible for organising youth clubs, mobile youth work, projects, events for young people, arranging babysitting and easily accessible counselling and coaching. It encourages teenagers and young adults between the ages of 12 and 20 to develop their own ideas and organise their free time. It provides assistance with a wide range of issues. Zurich International School

Zurich International School (ZIS) teaches international curricula and English-language teaching for children aged between 2 and 18. AHV-Zweigstelle / supplementary benefits to AHV/IV

The AHV-Zweigstelle in Adliswil provides information and advice on all matters relating to old-age and surviving dependents' insurance. Where a person's financial circumstances are limited, the entitlement to additional benefits to existing old-age or disability pensions is assessed and disbursed. The supplementary benefits office is also there to advise people on issues relating to the financing of their living costs in old age. Economics

A mix of businesses

The town of Adliswil is home to over a thousand businesses, covering a wide range of sectors and sizes. Most of the larger companies based here are located in the Sood district. Adliswil Trade and Industry Association (Handwerk und Gewerbeverein Adliswil, HGVA) represents the interests of business owners (e.g. skilled trades, services, industry, etc.). Among other things, the association is committed to promoting Adliswil and its local businesses and products, under the motto of "Lueg zerscht z'Adliswil" ("look at Adliswil first"). Zurich Park Side

The Zimmerberg-Sihltal business development agency is the point of contact for inter-municipal matters and can put you in touch with the right people in the district, for example on such issues as commercial space, plots of land or company start-ups and project ideas. Politics

Grosser Gemeinderat (Parliament)

Adliswil has had a communal parliament since 1974. The district council is the town's legislative body. It comprises 36 members and is elected by popular vote every four years. The district council convenes about ten times a year, and its meetings are open to the public. For information on members, resolutions and parties, visit: adliswil.ch/gemeinderat

Stadtrat (Town council)

The town council is the executive body and, like the district council, is elected by popular vote every four years. The town council comprises seven members, who are in charge of the following departments: Contact with local residents, finances, construction and planning, public utilities, safety/health/sport, social affairs and education. Schools committee

The schools committee is the supervisory authority for Adliswil's public schools and is responsible for running the schools and school policy. Its seven members are elected by popular vote. It is chaired by the head of the department of education (who is also a member of the town council).

Building committee

The building committee is responsible for planning permission procedures and the preservation of historical monuments. It also submits planning and civil engineering projects to the town council, as well as measures for the protection of nature and local heritage.

Social affairs committee

The social affairs committee is responsible for providing personal and financial assistance in accordance with the Social Welfare Act. It is also responsible for the supervision and licensing of day nurseries in Adliswil. It also determines advances on child support payments.



Elections and referendums

The elections office is responsible for organising elections and votes. An average of four referendums are held each year. Elections are held to elect the members of the national parliament, the government council and cantonal parliament, the town council and the district council, among others. In addition, eligible voters in Adliswil elect the members of the schools committee, representatives of the church communities (depending on the denomination) and the local magistrate. History

The area where the town of Adliswil is now located was settled around 700 BCE. The place name is derived from an Alemannic settler named "Adalot" who established a farm here in the 4th century. The coat of arms – an eagle above and a half-mill wheel below – harks back to a mill that was documented in 1248. The eagle symbolises the "Gasthof zum Adler" inn, where meetings were held from the 16th century onwards.

Most of the families living in Adliswil were farmers up until the 19th century. Its development began in 1839 with the construction of the Albisstrasse road to Zurich. A further boost came from the Sihltalbahn railway, which opened in 1892. Alongside two spinning mills, the mechanical silk fabric weaving mill in Adliswil (MSA) also had its machines powered by water from the Sihl. MSA went on to become one of the largest weaving mills in Switzerland. With industrialisation came a population boom – Adliswil's inhabitants increased to over 5,300.

The textile industry collapsed during the economic crisis of the 1930s. From 1942 to 1945, the second largest internment camp in Switzerland was established on the site of the now-defunct MSA. German Jews in particular, who had previously found refuge in southern France, escaped to Switzerland. The transit camp could accommodate around 500 people.

After World War II, Adliswil began to develop into a town. Thanks to its proximity to Zurich, its scenic attractions and good transport links, Adliswil's population grew to 16,500 in the 1980s. Construction work in the outer districts of Albishang (Wilacker and Breite) and Adliswil Nord (Dietlimoos, Lebern, Grüt) began in 2010. The population of Adliswil numbered 19'660 in 2023.



Administration and contacts

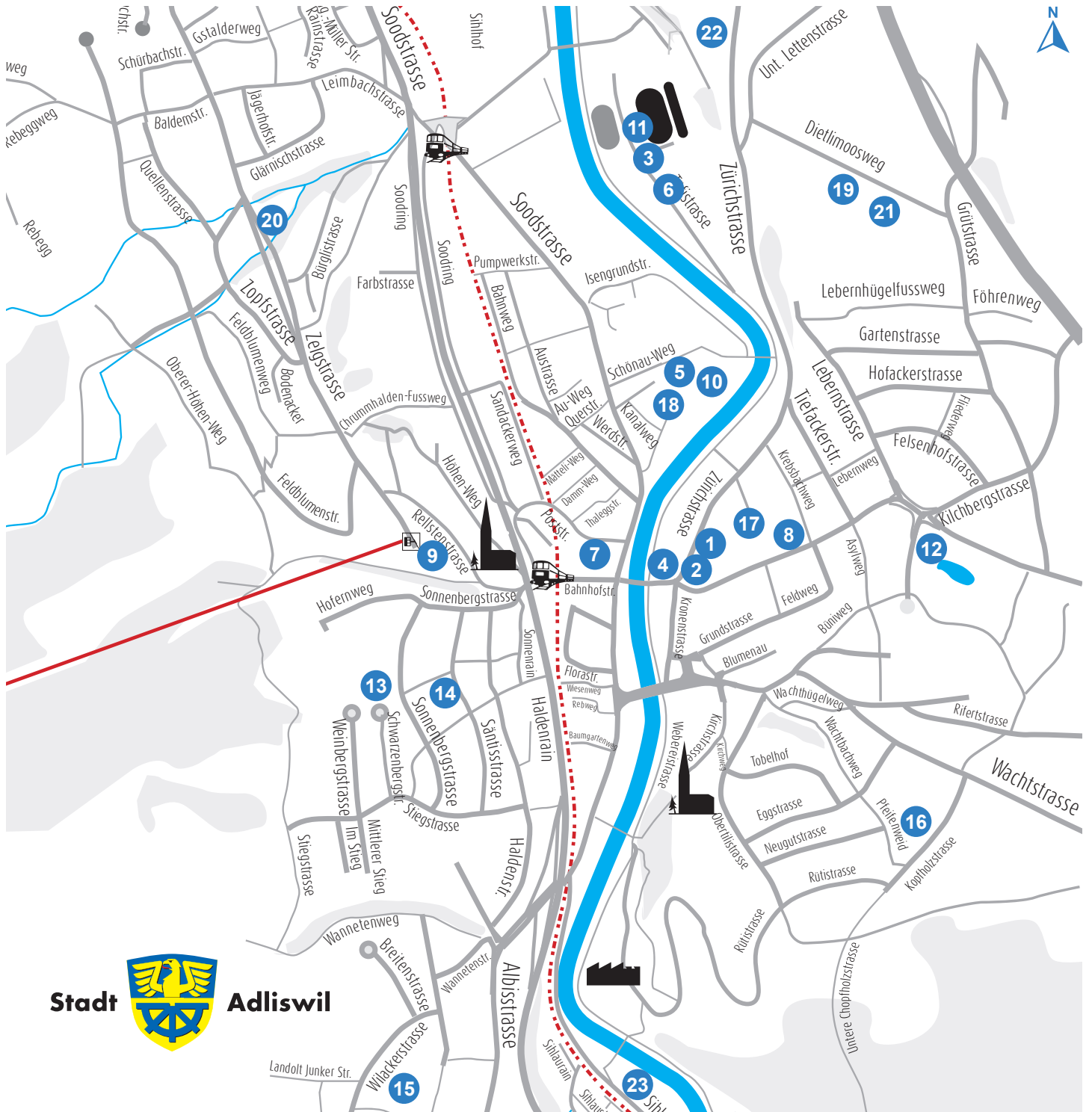
